

Rev. F. B. Dunham.

Rev. F. B. Dunham, pastor of the Church of the Redeemer, Fifty-Sixth street and Madison avenue, died at his home, No. 5720 Madison avenue, yesterday. Pneumonia was the cause of death. Rev. Mr. Dunham was born in Maryland in 1845. He attended Trinity College, Hartford, Conn., and after his ordination took charge of St. Luke's Church in Baltimore in 1873. He went to Mount Morris, N. Y., to officiate in St. John's Church. From there he went to Grace Church, Indianapolis. A few years later he went to New Albany, Ind. He went to Gainesville, Fla., and while there occupied a prominent place in religious circles. In 1883 he returned to Chicago and took charge of the Church of the Redeemer. He preached his farewell sermon on Easter Sunday, as he had been advised by his physicians to remove to a warmer climate. He intended to take up his residence in Cottonwood, Idaho. He leaves surviving him a widow, Susan C. Dunham, and three children—Frank C., John H., and Anna C. The interment will be at Oakwoods tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock. The funeral services will be conducted by the assistant pastor of the Church of the Redeemer, Rev. J. M. Davidson.
