Heyward Otis "Bud" Dunham, 79, of Mooresville, died July 14, 2001, in Regency Place of Greenwood at Greenwood.

Born April 28, 1922, in Zanesville, Ohio, he was the son of James Russell and Helen Augusta (Alexander) Dunham. He married Ethel Marie Fields March 20, 1954. She survives.

Dunham retired in 1984 after 40 years as an air conditioning engineer for Steamfitters and Pipefitters Union 440, Indianapolis.

He was a member of the Mooresville Friends Meeting, life member of both the Disabled American Veterans the Mooresville Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 1111, member of the Mooresville American Legion Post 103, Mooresville Masonic Lodge 78, Indianapolis Valley of the Scottish Rite and the Murat Shrine.

The World War II U.S. Navy veteran served his entire tour of duty on the USS Salt Lake, which was returning to Pearl Harbor at the time of the attack.

Other survivors include three sons, Daniel L. Dunham, Jonesboro, Steven J. Dunham, Mooresville and Frank E. Dunham of Brooklyn; two daughters, Cynthia L. Gardner and Marla R. Fredrick, both of Bloomington; two brothers, Charles E. Dunham of Greenwood and Harry K. Dunham of Henderson, Nev.; 13 grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.

The service will be 10 a.m. Tuesday at Carlisle & Son Funeral Chapel in Mooresville. Dr. Phil Collier will officiate. Burial will be in White Lick Cemetery.
